

About the author and editor:

Charmian Clift was born in the coastal town of Kiama, New South Wales, on 31 August 1923. After serving in the Australian Army, she joined the staff of the Melbourne Argus newspaper, and in 1947 married fellow journalist George Johnston. The next year, the couple's collaborative novel *High Valley* won the *Sydney Morning Herald* prize. Clift wrote the memoirs *Mermaid Singing* and *Peel Me A Lotus*, and her two novels, *Honour's Mimic* and *Walk to the Paradise Gardens*. Charmian Clift died in 1969.


Nadia Wheatley is the editor of *Sneaky Little Revolutions: Selected essays of Charmian Clift* and author of *The Life and Myth of Charmian Clift* which was *The Age* Non-Fiction Book of the Year, 2001, and won the NSW Premier's Australian History Prize (2002).

THE END OF THE MORNING CHARMIAN CLIFT, EDITED BY NADIA WHEATLEY

- The first publication of Charmian Clift's final and unfinished autobiographical novel, *The End of the Morning* reads as a standalone novella length work, as well as offering a fascinating insight into a fictionalised version of Clift's childhood in Kiama on the NSW South Coast

- Clift's biographer Nadia Wheatley has edited this book, as well as contributed a new afterword which delves into the story behind the novel — including some reasons why Clift never managed to complete her final novel
- Charmian Clift's work has garnered increasing interest in recent years, and there was lots of buzz following the article in the *SMH/Age* announcing this publication
- Charmian Clift's work has been described by critic Peter Craven as having 'more lightning and quicksilver, more brilliance and more skill of execution, than any Australian writing other than the great novels of Patrick White and Christina Stead'

During the years of the Great Depression, Cressida Morley and her eccentric family live in a weatherboard cottage on the edge of a wild beach. Outsiders in their small workingclass community, they rant and argue and read books and play music and never feel themselves to be poor. Yet as Cressida moves beyond childhood, she starts to outgrow the place that once seemed the centre of the world. As she plans her escape, the only question is: who will she become?

criticism in both English and Chinese, including his award-winning novels *The Eastern Slope Chronicle* (2002) and *The English Class* (2010), his collection of poetry *Songs of the Last Chinese Poet* (1997) and his poetry book *Terminally Poetic* (2020), which won the Judith Wright Calanthe Award for a Poetry Book in the 2021 Queensland Premier's Literary Awards. 

A father and son muse on the value of fame and fortune and the path of *chu jia* or receding from the world by becoming a monk. On Christmas Eve a lonely immigrant travels from his deserted outer suburb to the city in search of life. Spouses navigate their adult son's need to 'rebrand' himself with an English name. Between Shanghai and Montreal, a Chinese student and a Canadian man who has fallen in love with him exchange correspondence. Haunted by the sounds of piano and violin and the long-lost friend who returns only to him in dreams a man confronts the past. Can we ever really trust a car salesperson or those friends who say we must catch up soon but never do?

Ouyang Yu's first collection of stories in English is both assured and tender and at times surprisingly funny. It includes stories set in China and Australia that revel in the truth and candour of lived experience and the joys and constraints of language. In *The White Cockatoo Flowers* Ouyang Yu deftly peels back the layers on what it means to move from one culture to another, and what it means to be a writer, a husband, a parent and a stranger on foreign and familiar ground.







Naag Mountain is a journey across oceans, from the Asian subcontinent to the South Seas, a journey about human trafficking on sugar plantations in Fiji and Australia, which brings to life the histories and events, the stories and myths of a displaced and exploited people, that have been lost in time or forgotten or hidden from view. It is a journey in which the living, the dead and the natural world communicate in music, language and dream.

Manisha Anjali's first collection is an intensely imagined recovery of a little-known cultural inheritance, in which historical figures, folk characters and mythical entities feature in a procession coloured by the metaphors of poetry and the surrealism of dreams. A community in northern Queensland, whose ancestors were indentured by the Colonial Sugar Refining Company, receive messages from their friends across the Tasman. A mysterious reel of film washes ashore, depicting harrowing violence on sugarcane plantations under the indenture system. The actors walk out of the film and into the world of the living. The community walk into the projection.

Narrated in multiple voices and laced with archival fragments and scholarly interjections, it offers an intimate glimpse into the lives of women and girls in a community that has historically been characterised as both a 'yellow peril' menace and an exotic 'model minority'.
