New collection by prize-winning singer, songwriter and poet

Song in the Grass is Kate Fagan's most personal collection to date. Each of its five sequences moves out in a widening circle from where the poet is standing in life. The collection is an almanac of significant changes; in particular, new lives begun in the Blue Mountains during a transfiguring time of parenthood, against a backdrop of climate uncertainty.

A precise language of environmental observation is braided into stories of family and kin networks. Careful descriptions of place anchor this collection in ecological watchfulness. Birds are sentinel to environmental change, and symbols of spiritual transformation. *Song in the Grass* includes over sixty different species of endemic or migratory Australian birds.

Archival practices of all kinds – what one poem describes as "a lyrical index" – offer touchstones for this sonically rich collection, in which poetry becomes a way of sustaining love over distance, a collective music, and a compass for navigating incommon emergencies.

Kate Fagan is a writer, musician and scholar whose third volume, *First Light*, was shortlisted for the NSW Premier's Literary Awards and the *Age* Book of the Year Award. She directs The Writing Zone, a mentoring program for emerging writers and arts workers from Western Sydney, and is a former Editor of *How2* magazine (US). Kate is also an internationally esteemed songwriter whose album *Diamond Wheel* won the National Film and Sound Archive's Folk Recording Award. She is currently Director of the WSU Writing and Society Research Centre and Chair of the *Sydney Review of Books* Advisory Board.

A new edition of Beverley Farmer's classic 1980 debut, out of print for many years. *Alone* captures the emergence of one of Australia's most powerful and distinctive writers.

Set in Melbourne in the late 1950s, and taking place over the course of two days and nights, *Alone* chronicles the feelings of obsession and hopelessness, isolation and desire provoked by the ending of an intimate relationship. A young woman, a fledgling writer, recalls her passion for her female lover, who has left her. She is estranged from her family and has dropped out of university, and is contemplating ending her life. As she travels through the night-time streets, industrial areas and boarding houses of a Melbourne fallen into economic depression and cultural malaise, she reflects on the days and months past that have brought her to despair.

Written in a style threaded with gothic motifs, and shadowed by the constant threat of sexual violence, Beverley Farmer's debut novel captures the romantic intensity and ironic reversals of youthful longing. It displays her remarkable capacity for bringing different forms of writing together in a single work, prose and poetry, dialogue and dramatic monologue, as well as her reflections on other writers' work. Based partly on her own experiences, *Alone* shows the formation of a literary voice in writing that is both heightened and flowing, lyrical and precise.

Beverley Farmer (1941–2018) was the author of the novels *Alone, The Seal Woman*, and *The House in the Light*, which was shortlisted for the Miles Franklin Literary Award, and of four collections of short stories, including *Milk*, which won the NSW Premier's Award for Fiction. She is also known for the writer's notebook *A Body of Water*, and *The Bone House*, a collection of essays on the life of the body and the life of the mind, both published by Giramondo. Her last work of fiction, *This Water: Five Tales* (Giramondo, 2018), was longlisted for the Stella Prize. In 2009 Farmer received the Patrick White Award for her contribution to Australian Literature.






Sometimes has written the celestial subjectively – or is it the subjective celestially? – and smears the lines between the practices of cosmology, poetry, and astrophysics. After reading this collection, it seems to me like poetry is as valid a method of interrogating the universe as any other.
