Through this stratigraphic interpretation of 'place' — one where the poet's own relation to different social, cultural, and historical strata is brought into question through a network of exchange — *Holocene Pointbreaks* points toward a type of eco-antipoetics: an interrogation of not only human and nonhuman relations, but the very nature of nature, and what it means to write 'ecopoetry' as a settler on the unceded lands of First Nations People.
