Author's Notes

My inspiration for "Nightlife" came one night while camping in the bush sitting quietly, listening to the night rustlings. So many animals are active in the evening or in the darkness, over 80% of our native wildlife in fact!

I started wondering how many of our native species are disregarded by most people because they are nocturnal, after all It's very hard to get humans to care about what they can't see. I wanted to represent some of these hidden animals in their varying habitats to bring to light the diversity of not only our native animals but also our beautiful landscapes.

I have visited and camped in many different natural environments across Australia and drew upon personal experience to illustrate some of those places in a stylized form. I also made good use of my large collection of nature guidebooks, had interesting conversations with researchers and ecologists and spent hours browsing nature websites to gather information to capture the character each focus animal and the plants and other animals that share each respective habitat.

All of the animals represented occupy a special role within the larger ecology and I have included just a fraction of interesting information on each page to compliment the prose piece that comprises the main narrative. I hope this book inspires the reader to develop and nurture their own fascination for the nocturnal world.

What new words did you learn in the book?


At the back of the book there is a glossary of some of the more unfamiliar terms in the book. Can you find other words or terms that are new or unfamiliar and make a class glossary for the book?
