


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Moxie vs Cat Memes

Synopsis

A Story about focusing on those around you in a screen-distracted world

Moxie vs Cat Memes follows a dog called Moxie who feels neglected by her owner, Wally who is too busy watching cat memes. Moxie has to be very clever to find a way to capture Wally's attention to remind him that she's his special girl deserving of his love and attention.

Themes

- Healthy screen time
- Prioritising relationships over excessive technology use
- The intrinsic value of each individual and their deserving of love and attention

Discussion Questions

- How does Moxie feel when Wally is constantly distracted by his phone?
- What does Moxie do to try and get Wally's attention?
- After Moxie pulls Wally away from the screen, how does Wally feel about choosing to spend his whole day on his screen?
- How do you think Moxie feels when Wally decides to spend the next day with her?
- What is more important? The people and pets around us? Or spending all day on our screens?
- How can we organise our day so that we can enjoy some screen time but also allow lots
 of time with the people and pets we love?

Activities

Draw

Ask students to draw two scenes.

- 1. A picture where Moxie is wanting to get Wally's attention
- 2. A picture where Wally and Moxie are playing together

Ask the students about how Moxie feels in key illustrations and why.

Write

Ask students to write about:

- A time they wanted to tell somebody something but the person wasn't paying attention.
- A time they were using their screen and somebody wanted to talk to them

Discuss ways to balance both situations.
